



## GEOMETRY Syllabus

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Welcome to Geometry. QUEST works cooperatively as a TEAM to bring the finest education to your child. We are committed to the following CORE VALUES:

**I. Textbook:** *Prentice Hall Geometry*. This is a high school level textbook and course. The course will cover all basic aspects of geometry plus some work in preparation for ALGEBRA 2 which is the course that follows this one in ninth grade. Only students with a grade of 95% or better at the time of recommendations will be considered for HONORS ALGEBRA 2/Trig. Please refer to the textbook for a complete list of the CA Standards that will be covered in this course.

### II. Grading System

90 – 100% = A	Advanced
80 – 89% = B	Proficient
70 – 79% = C	Basic
60 – 69% = D	Below Basic
0 – 59% = F	Far Below Basic

**GRADE Breakdown:** Practice: **20%** Tests/Quizzes: **80%**

**TESTS are never sent home** for security reasons. Parents may make an appt to see their child's file any time during the course of the year. Grades can be seen at any time once a student receives password/login information for Snapgrades, an online grading system.

### III. Practice/Homework Policy

1. Homework will be assigned every class day with very few exceptions. Students are expected to write down assignments in their planners. Each assignment is numbered. Planners are stamped at the beginning of class to verify that the student wrote down the assignment. It does not mean that work was completed successfully. Parents are encouraged to compare the planner HW # with their child's spiral ring notebook to verify that the HW was done.
2. **ONLINE HELP** ([www.phschool.com](http://www.phschool.com)). Go to button on lower right called "Course Content" and click the button on bottom. On next page, click the MATH button on menu to left side. Next click "Textbook Companion Sites". Click the book above the HIGH SCHOOL site (top one, third from left). Click on our book. Now you can take practice quizzes, etc. This is a great tool. Be aware that some quizzes are mixed up. Not sure why but perhaps they refer to newer edition of our book or they are simply "people" errors.
3. **ABSENT work:** It is a student's responsibility to obtain make-up work. Call your STUDY BUDDY for it or ask to see teacher's planner where it can be found.
4. **Specific Guidelines:** HW is to be in pencil only. Be neat, write every problem out first except those that are longer than a sentence. Show work – every step. Circle, box or highlight answers.

Use graph paper when asked to graph. You may cut and paste it onto your HW or you may simply use graph paper spiral notebooks for everything. It's a great way to keep neat and organized if you really use the grids to guide you. Correct in **COLOR** as able from the back of the book. Rework problems until you get them correct. Remember to do the HW the same day it is assigned. Come by for help at Brunch the next day if you have any difficulty. "I didn't get it" is a poor excuse. Late work is accepted for partial credit and only if turned in within the next few days.

#### **IV. Classroom Management Policy**

- A. **NECESSARY PASSES:** Each student gets two passes per quarter. These may be used for a restroom visit, drinking fountain. They are not transferable meaning you can't give your pass to another student or use a Quarter 1 pass in Quarter 2.
- B. To maintain a positive and effective learning environment, the following agreements are made
  1. Treat all people and property with respect.
  2. Be in class, seated with planner out when the bell rings or you are considered tardy.
  3. Bring your supplies to class every day.
  4. Raise your hand and wait to be called on before speaking or leaving your seat.
  5. Use appropriate and respectful language at all times.
  6. No food, drinks or gum allowed. Water is ok.
  7. All electronics must be packed away and not out during class or they will be confiscated and returned after school.
  8. No core passing without permission

Consequences for breaking class agreements are

1. Teacher warning
2. Lunch Detention, call home
3. Lunch Detention, call home, team discipline (parents may be invited to attend as well)
4. Lunch Detention, call home, referral to counselor
5. Lunch Detention, call home, referral to assistant principal

**GUEST TEACHER ALERT:** "I have very high expectations for student behavior when a guest teacher is in my place. Consequences follow the same as when I am present and can include a teacher conference, detention, referral to the office and even class suspension in severe cases."

#### **V. Attendance Policy**

Attendance is important and directly related to success. Students should be in their seats when the tardy bell rings or they are tardy. The School Tardy Policy and the District Attendance Policy will be strictly enforced. The School Tardy Policy is outlined in the student planner. Tardy discipline is handled by our attendance office.

**VI. SUPPLIES NEEDED:** always have a **reading book** for times when you finish up early in class. A reading book is required for **Advisory reading** time as well.

- 1 to 2 spiral notebooks per quarter (70 page type): for warm-ups, lesson notes and practice/homework

- #2 pencils: You should have several pencils on hand. Better yet is to have two mechanical pencils (Pentel-Twist Erase are pricey but long lasting) plus extra lead and eraser tips.
- Erasers – (pentel white erasers are great)
- Correcting pens (colored)
- Colored pencils or markers for highlighting and/or for showing different math steps to help make your notes more interesting/fun
- Scientific Calculator like a Texas Ti-30Xs11s which is what we have in class. No graphing calculators.
- Straight-edge/ruler, compass

**VII. Movie Permission:** There are several movies that may or may not be shown during the year. These are used in part mostly to illustrate or serve as a topic teaser. For instance, I use a clip from *The Great Debaters* to illustrate a particular logic term used in reasoning. Please circle any movies in the following list that you DO NOT want your child to see.
